## How Christ Loves His Church

The Church is precious to the Lord Jesus Christ. He gave Himself for her, humbly submitting to a life of suffering which ended in the pain and shame of the cross. The Church is His bride, whom He has betrothed and will return to take to Himself at the great Marriage



Supper of the Lamb, to live with her for all eternity. The Church is His body, which He has raised to new life and nourishes with his own Spirit and Word, causing it to grow and flourish, even in a world which is often a hostile environment. Christ loves the Church so much that he came to redeem her and will return to glorify her, presenting her as a bride without spot, blemish or wrinkle. But how does Christ love His Church now, in that time between His first and second coming? In other words, how is Christ presently loving His Church?

One of the primary ways in which Christ is presently loving His church is through His people. In John 13:1-17, Jesus humbled Himself and washed His disciples' feet, showing an example of His love for His people. He then instructed His disciples to do just as He had done. The disciples were to be the means by which Christ would continue to show His love for the Church. Believers are therefore a means by which Christ is loving His Church.

Pastor Paul Tripp refers to Christians as “instruments in the Redeemer’s hands” and that is a fitting description. Just as a skillful doctor uses surgical instruments to care for his patients, so also the great Physician uses His people as instruments to care for His body. Think of the great honor and privilege you have, that Almighty God,

who, without the use of any means created all things, has determined to use you as the means of accomplishing the care and love of His most precious possession, His Church.

This also involves a great responsibility to make yourself available. You cannot be used if you are not present. Just as medicine which is left on the pharmacy shelf is no good to the sick person in the home, or a surgical tool in the cabinet is no good to the patient, you will be of no good use to anyone if you are not present with them. God will still accomplish all His holy will, but you will miss out on being used as an instrument in His hands.

We must understand that being a member of the church is not about us. It is not about what we enjoy, what we receive, or what we think we need. It is about ministering to one another in the midst of a hostile world bent on destroying our faith. We desperately need each other.

In our day there is a temptation to treat the church as a commodity, to use when we feel we need it, but to disregard it when we are doing okay. Thus, you may attend the prayer meeting when you really need prayer, but when life is going well, you feel no need. You may desire to speak with the elders or the pastor when you are sick or struggling with a particular sin, but when you are self-assured physically and spiritually you might not have the time.

This fails to recognize two things. First, it assumes that you know what you need when you need it. One of the greatest errors we can fall into is thinking that we know what we need and when we need it. Only God knows the specifics and the timing of your need, and He has planned to meet it through His Church. Second, it assumes that others don't need you! This is unbiblical thinking. Paul, writing to the Corinthian church, teaches that the "eye cannot say to the hand, 'I have no need of you' nor again the head to the feet, 'I have no need of you.'" To think this way is presumptive and dangerous, because you need others and others need you!

The Church is precious to Christ, and if His Spirit dwells in you, His Church will be precious to you. Is the Church precious to you? I do not mean the building or the activities, but the people. Are you making yourself available to minister to others according to their needs, and are you willing to receive the ministry that you desperately need? May we all grow together in our love for God and for one another.

Cody Cook arrived home to his wife and children on January 27<sup>th</sup>. Cody has been deployed in Kuwait for the past year.




## February Schedule
